ASSISTANCE NEEDED PRESBYTERY DAY AT KINCARDINE UNITED CHURCH APRIL 18, 2017

On April 18, 2017 Kincardine United Church will be hosting the Bruce Presbytery Meeting.

The Lighthouse Unit has agreed to be in charge of the day in regards to hosting and feeding the Presbytery Members, approximately 80 people. We will need assistance from the congregation to do this.

We will be serving muffins, cheese and fruit in the morning, lasagna, coleslaw and cakes for lunch. Assistance from members of the congregation is needed in food donations and working that day.

We need the following:

- 1. A greeter (or two) to welcome people in the morning, check them in and give them their name tags. Time commitment would be from 8:15 to 10.
- 2. A person to check the people off the lunch list and collect the money for lunch. Time commitment would be from 11:30 to 12:30.
- 3. Individuals to work in the kitchen in the morning set out the muffins etc, coffee, tea, cups. Etc. Also do dishes as required. Time commitment would be from 7:30 to 10:30.
- 4. Individuals to work in the kitchen to prepare the lunch -put lasagnas in the oven, put coleslaw in bowls, set up serving tables for lunch and desserts, ensure coffee, tea, juice etc are ready. Also ensure the muffins, coffee etc are topped up. Time commitment would be from 10:30 to 1:00.
- 5. Individuals to clean up after lunch, do dishes etc. Time commitment would be from 12:30 til done (hopefully about 1.5 hours)
- 6. The following food is required:

Coleslaw (approx 6) – can be vinegrette dressing or creamy dressing Dessert – squares or cakes (approx 6) (need a gluten free option) Muffins (approx 4 dozen)

Dinner rolls – approx 8 doz (need a gluten free option)

HUMAN RIGHTS IN THE PHILIPPINES

Our gifts for Mission & Service support human rights. Let us hear a story from the Philippines.

"The prevailing situation of the Philippine society is even worse when seen through the prophetic eyes of the church. There is major ongoing social unrest in our country today," says the Rev. Jerome Baris of the United Church of Christ in the Philippines.

Mission & Service partners the United Church of Christ in the Philippines and the National Council of Churches in the Philippines are actively involved in advocacy for human rights.

Human rights violations are widespread, with thousands of activists being intimidated, "disappeared," jailed without charges or trial, or killed. These people have stood for the rights of the Filipino people, including Indigenous people, who are often involved in land disputes with the government and corporations, particularly around mining. The United Church of Christ in the Philippines and the National Council of Churches in the Philippines are calling for peaceful resolutions to conflicts and for assurances that the people most affected will be included in the discussions. They condemn violent responses to communities trying to determine their own futures.

We sing thanksgiving for Mission & Service partners walking with people in the Philippines in their struggle for human rights.




