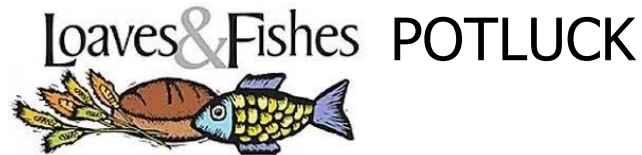


SERVICE OF PRAYERS WITH THE MUSIC OF TAIZÉ
