Friday, May 5th Is Red Dress Day

The National Inquiry into Missing and Murdered Indigenous Women and Girls, which began its journey in August 2016 to learn the truth and find solutions to end the alarming rates of violence against Indigenous women and girls, completed its work in a closing ceremony on June 3, 2019.

The National Inquiry's Final Report reveals that persistent and deliberate human and Indigenous rights violations and abuses are the root causes behind Canada's staggering rates of violence against Indigenous women and girls.

Here are only three of the report's Calls to Action:

- 15.1 Denounce and speak out against violence against Indigenous women, and girls.
- 15.2 Decolonize by learning the true history of Canada and Indigenous history in your local area. Learn about and celebrate Indigenous Peoples' history, cultures, pride, and diversity, acknowledging the land you live on and its importance to local Indigenous communities, both historically and today.
- 15.6 Protect, support, and promote the safety of women and girls by acknowledging and respecting the value of every person and every community, as well as the right of Indigenous women and girls to generate their own, self-determined solutions.



This is Miss Kettle & Stony Point Jr., Jaylynn Wolfe with red dresses who was 13 when this picture was taken but is now 16. She is a proud member of Kettle and Stony Point First Nation, although she lives in Kincardine.



This is Jaylynn's Jingle Dress – her **RED** Jingle Dress. She says it means the world to her to wear this dress and to be able to dance for all the families of the Missing and Murdered Indigenous Women and Girls that need so much healing. Jaylynn has been a Jingle Dress dancer since she was 7. Jingle Dress dances are meant as dances of forgiveness and of healing. She often wonders what would happen to her family if SHE had been murdered.

When Jaylynn dances, she is dancing to promote forgiveness and healing for **both** Indigenous and settler folk in response to the National Inquiry Report about Missing and Murdered Indigenous Women and Children.
