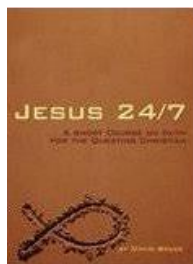


THE SHORTBREAD PROJECT – BAKERS NEEDED!

THE DORY DROP-IN CENTRE KINCARDINE

The Canadian Mental Health Association(CHMA) Grey Bruce Branch has an office for mental health clients on the corner of Queen and Durham Sts. in Kincardine. CHMA, founded in 1918, is one of Canada's oldest voluntary associations and is the only one that deals with all aspects of mental health and illness. The Kincardine site offers counselling, every day living assistance and social support.

The Leisure Links Program is a social recreational program of the CHMA. This program provides opportunities for people with mental health issues to meet others in an informal, relaxed and friendly environment. Social interaction with others and assistance to connect with activities within the community is also available through the Leisure Links Program. This program started a drop-in centre known as the DORY at the corner of Queen St. and Durham St. Andrew Vavoid is the recreational director.

About 12 years ago two counsellors came to a Bruce Presbytery meeting and presented this program to our group. When asked what Bruce Presbytery could do to contribute to the program, we were asked to start a luncheon for clients attending the Dory. This would give them an opportunity to socialize with the people in Kincardine.

Our church started to do a monthly lunch in Nov 2007 by Lighthouse Unit (Unit 5). We also have several members from the Anglican Church and Presbyterian Church helping monthly. At first the numbers attending were small but have been growing steadily. We usually serve around 25 guests including our workers. A complete meal is served every month. The menu varies to include salads, casseroles, soup and sandwich, ham and scalloped potatoes, turkey and of course dessert. All the food is donated by members of the 3 churches participating. Guests may contribute to the food bank or make a donation. All donations are given to the food bank every year. We have become friends with our guests and we enjoy each others' company very much.

We would like to invite more members of our church to become part of this outreach. Please feel free to join us for lunch. Also donations of food and workers are always welcome. The menu is set the week before and emails are sent out requesting workers and food donations. Our lunches at noon are on the last Tues of each month. In Dec. it is held on the Friday when the hampers are distributed.

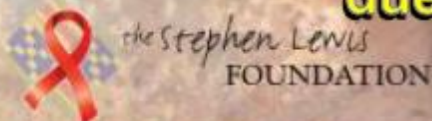

MINUTE FOR MISSIONS

BREAKING DOWN STEREOTYPES

Our gifts for Mission & Service support peace and justice work. Let us hear a story from Lebanon.

What will it take to bring peace to the Middle East? Mission & Service partner the Middle East Council of Churches believes it includes creating opportunities for youth to relate to one another across differences and to reject judgment and stereotypes.

The realities of the region mean that Christians and Muslims live in a state of heightened tension and potential conflict. In Lebanon these tensions have been exacerbated by the influx of a large number of displaced persons, many from Syria, who have stretched to the breaking point communities' capacity to cope.

The Middle East Council of Churches plans to bring together groups of youth aged 15–22 in Lebanon. The youth will meet with one another to discuss, work, and play together to lay the foundations for new and positive ways of understanding and seeing one another beyond traditional boundaries and barriers. The experience will give participants real and practical models for Muslim–Christian dialogue in their own communities.

We sing thanksgiving for the ways that Mission & Service is in the Middle East helping to change hearts and minds for the sake of peace and justice.
