HOME AT LAST 'HAL'

A Program to support aging, frail adults or people with special needs to settle at home upon discharge from hospital

The secret ingredient of this service is the personal attention given. On discharge day, a HAL attendant will meet the patient in their room, support them through the discharge process and escort them to their home, in an accessible van. Once settled, the attendant can assist with errands such as grocery, prescription or medical equipment pickup, if required.

There is **no fee** for services provided by HAL, however the client will be responsible to pay for pharmacy costs and/or groceries.

The attendant ensures the client is safe and comfortable, providing Home Management.

Our HAL program also includes a next day telephone reassurance call, a complimentary 'Meals on Wheels' meal and more follow-up calls from HAL staff.

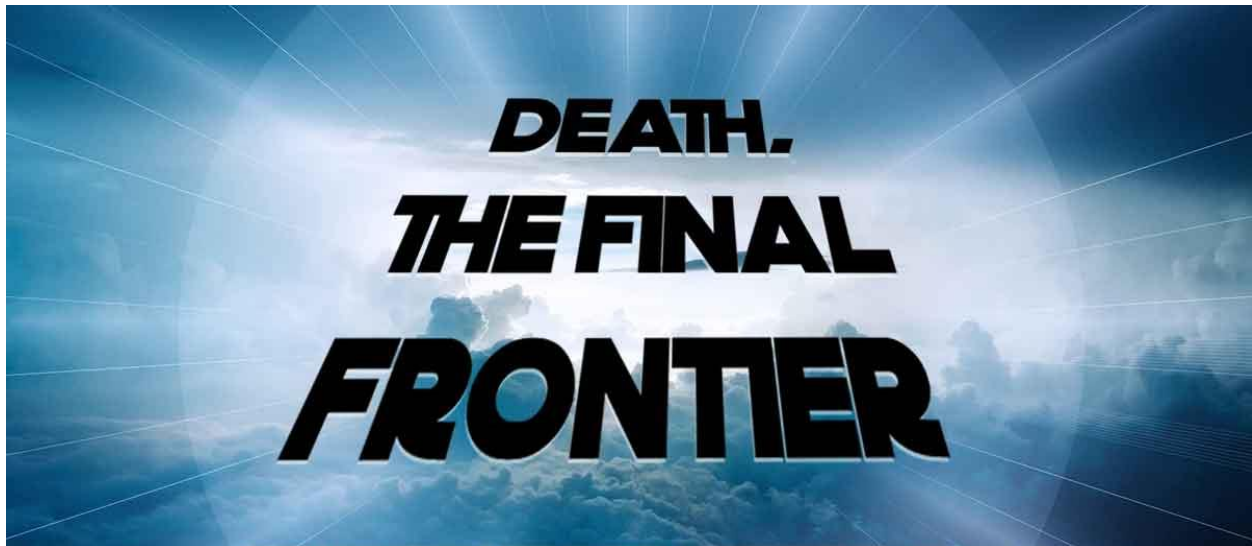
ORANGE SHIRT DAY IS COMING UP: 2023 EVERY CHILD MATTERS T-SHIRT DESIGN



A big heartfelt congratulations to contest winner, Charliss Santos, for her vision of “Every Child Matters”. Charliss is a grade 10 student at St. Augustine School in Ponoka, Alberta, Canada, and her design showcases an Indigenous child encompassed in two hands and surrounded by people, a heart, and an eagle. The child’s silhouette represents all the Indigenous children who suffered or were impacted by the Indian Residential schools. The people surrounding the child represent the strong communities of the Indigenous people and the way they support each other.

The heart represents healing and forgiveness, and the eagle symbolizes acceptance, honesty, and freedom. **Orange Shirt Day was yesterday, September 30, 2023.**
